The Conditional TENSE

+ S+WOULD+INFINITIVE

I **would buy** a Ferrari

I'd buy

- S+WOULDN'T+INFINITIVE

I **wouldn't like** to live in London.

? WOULD+S+INFINITIVE?

Would you like to visit Kenya?

Type Zero Conditionals

If+S+PRESENT SIMPLE, S+PRESENT SIMPLE

If you **heat** ice, it **melts**.



Type I Conditionals

If+S+PRESENT SIMPLE, S+FUTURE SIMPLE

If it **rains**, I **will stay** at home.



Type II Conditionals

If+S+PAST SIMPLE, S+CONDITIONAL SIMPLE

If I **won** the Lottery, I **would buy** a Ferrari.



Type II Conditionals with the verb TO BE

If+S+PAST SIMPLE, S+CONDITIONAL SIMPLE

We use WERE for all the forms in formal English.

If I **were** an animal, I **would be**

a tiger.



Type III Conditionals

If+S+PAST PERFECT, S+ PERFECT CONDITIONAL SIMPLE

If I **had won** the lottery, I **would have bought** a ferrari.

I didn't win!
